

Enabling Javascript

Javascript is used by the National Open Art Competition, to validate many of the items used in registration and submission.

Failure to have it running can result in loss of some functionality, e.g. buttons not showing.

Below are the ways to enable it as of 22 Mar 2016. The site above lists some earlier versions.

Firefox 19.0.2 on Windows

On the menu bar, select Tools, then select the 'Content' tab, make sure there is a tick in 'Enable JavaScript'

Firefox 45... on Windows

Javascript is enabled by default. Click [here](#) for more information.

Internet Explorer 9 to 11 on Windows

On the menu bar select "Tools" menu and select "Internet Options".

In the "Internet Options" window select the "Security" tab.

On the "Security" tab click on the "Custom level..." button.

When the "Security Settings - Internet Zone" dialog window opens, look for the "Scripting" section.

In the "Active Scripting" item select "Enable". Note: this is nearly at the bottom of the list

When the "Warning!" window pops out asking "Are you sure you want to change the settings for this zone?" select "Yes".

In the "Internet Options" window click on the "OK" button to close it.

Click on the "Refresh" button of the web browser to refresh the page.

Google Chrome on Windows

Click the Customise icon (top right hand corner)

From the list click on 'Settings'

At the bottom of the page click on 'Advanced Settings'

Click the 'Content Settings' button

Make sure 'Allow all sites to run JavaScript (recommended)' is checked

Click on 'Done'

Safari 6.0.3 to 9... on Mac

On the menu bar, select 'Safari', select Preferences', 'Security'. Make sure there is a tick in 'Enable JavaScript'

Firefox 19.0.2 on Mac

On the menu bar, select 'Firefox', select 'Preferences', 'Content' tab. Make sure there is a tick in 'Enable JavaScript'

Firefox 34 to 44.... on Mac

Microsoft Edge on Windows 10

Javascript is enabled by default. If it has been disabled, then:

"Computer Configuration: > "Administrative Templates" > "Windows Components" > "Microsoft Edge"

or

"User Configuration: > "Administrative Templates" > "Windows Components" > "Microsoft Edge"
